Maintain an overall 3.0 gpa (You may be accepted into Teacher Prep. with a lower gpa, but there is no guarantee.)
Before Student Teaching
To student teach in VA, you must be eligible to teach except for completing ENGL 482 Student Teaching.
Complete Student Teaching Professional Semester Initial Placement Request on Tk20
Complete by April 15 for spring student teaching; November 15 for fall student teaching
Submit a passing score on Praxis II Test: English Language, Literature, and Composition, Test #5038 (167 or higher); the test is only offered occasionally and scores take weeks; see info at https://www.ets.org .

Submit scores with other requirements, but the last date to submit scores if you fail and have to retake is June 1 for fall student teaching and the December 1 for spring student teaching.
