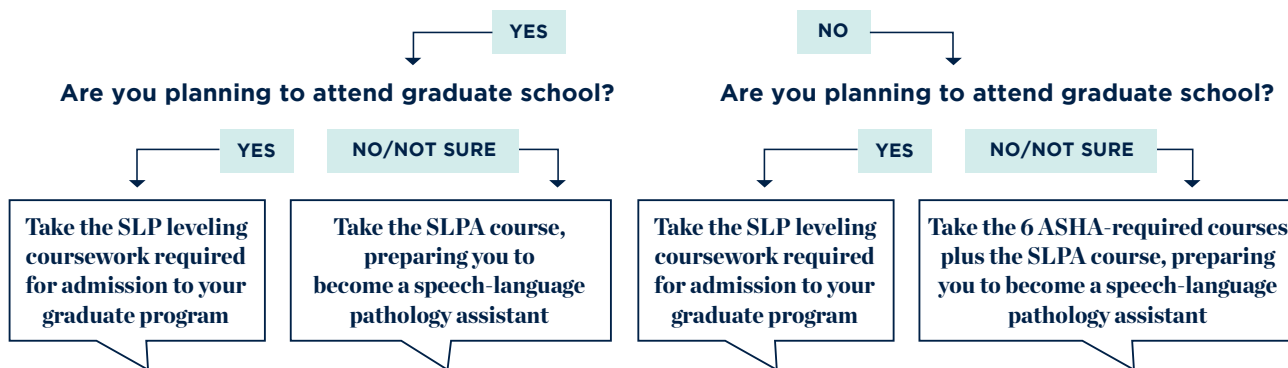


Courses at a glance
